Obituary for the Doughboy

99- a Card Game for a Bunch

Deal 3 cards to each player. Each player has 3 tokens. The King has a value of 99, the 4 reverses the direction of play, a 10 subtracts 10 and a 9 holds the count. The first player lays a card and says the value (eg 5) the next player adds to the score and so on until 99 is reached. If the next player does not have a card to play (King, 4, 10 or 9) he is out and pays one token to the center. Play is repeated until only one player has tokens.
