

## CRO-HOOKING WITH A DOUBLE ENDED CROCHET HOOK

### Materials

Double ended crochet hook  
2 balls of yarn – different colors

This afghan is multiples of 3 plus 1. A lap throw 121 stitches, twin size – 151 and a double is 181 stitches.

### First color

Chain stitches required.

Row 1 - Pull yarn through 2<sup>nd</sup> chain from hook. Pick up each chain loop and make into a stitch on the needle. Count stitches making sure you have the same as when you started – multiples of 3 plus 1. Turn needle to other hook end.

### Second color

Row 2 – Pull yarn through first stitch (let's call this an anchor stitch).

\*Chain 3, pull yarn through 3 loops\* Repeat to end of row. Chain 1 (this is the anchor stitch for the next color).

Row 3 - Now you are going to put all the loops back on the needle by going through each loop, grab the yarn and pull through the loop. Turn needle to other hook end.

Change to first color.

Each time you turn the needle you will be changing colors.

To finish the project using the first color you started with.

Pull yarn through first stitch, grab yarn with needle and pull through 2 stitches, grab yarn and pull through 2 stitches all the way to the end of row. Tie off.
