Alberta Women's Institutes Handicraft List

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Rules and Guidelines for Entry

1. *NO MORE THAN ONE ENTRY PER CLASS will be allowed from an Alberta Women's Institutes Branch, Associate Member or Provincial Life member who does not belong to a branch.*
2. *All entries must be the work of the Member entering them.*
3. *All entries must follow the criteria set forth in this list.*
4. *All articles must have been completed in the year preceding the competition.*
5. *Articles must never have been entered in any section of the Alberta Women's Institutes Provincial Handicraft Competition in any previous year.*
6. *All entries must be clean, and complete, as to its intended use, as any incomplete or soiled articles will not be judged.*
7. *Watch for deadlines and dates of where to mail entry information and your parcels in the Home & Country publications and the Mail Outs from the Provincial Office. It is very important that these deadlines are met and the information in them followed.*
8. *When entry forms are sent in, it is very important, in order to calculate the Branch placing, to enclose the following information:*
 - A) *Name of Branch*
 - B) *Total number of Branch Members*
 - C) *Contact Persons Name*
 - D) *Contact Persons Telephone Number*
 - E) *Name and Contact Information for the person picking up articles*
9. *When filling out entry forms please list classes in numerical order.*
10. *Please list contact person's name and telephone number.*
11. *Please make three (3) copies of the entry form.*
 - A) *One is sent to the Handicraft Coordinator by the set **DEADLINE**.*
 - B) *One is sent in the boxes with the articles to the competition.*
 - C) *One is sent with the person who will be picking up the entries.*
12. *The official Blue Handicraft Tags must be used to tag your entries. These tags are available from the Alberta Women's Institutes Provincial Office.*
13. *No articles to be accepted for display only or not entered into any class. All disqualified articles will be placed in respective branch packing tubs.*
14. *Adjustments to your entry form can be made until the stated deadline.*
15. *All articles must be entered and tagged with the correct section letter and class number.*
16. *TAGS MUST BE FILLED OUT AND ATTACHED TO EACH ARTICLE SECURELY.*
17. *Do not use straight pins to attach tags to articles as this may damage other articles.*
18. *Please ship or deliver your entries to the address given in the Home & Country publication and the entry form information package.*
19. *NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.*
20. *The Danish System of Judging will be used unless otherwise stated in this list. The points available for each class are listed beside each class.*

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21. *All items must be laid flat on a table to be judged.*
22. *Placings in the Danish System of Judging are as follows:*
 - A) *Large Article Classes that have 10 Points allotted are:*

<i>First:</i>	<i>10, 9, or 8 points awarded</i>
<i>Second:</i>	<i>7, 6 or 5 points awarded</i>
<i>Third:</i>	<i>4, 3, 2, or 1 point awarded</i>
 - B) *Small Article Classes that have 5 Points allotted are:*

<i>First:</i>	<i>5, or 4 points awarded</i>
<i>Second:</i>	<i>3, or 2 points awarded</i>
<i>Third:</i>	<i>1 point awarded</i>
23. *Classes for over 70, 80 and 90 years will be eligible for points towards winning the Provincial Shield, for the high points per member in each entering Branch.*
24. *The Myrtle (Olsen Roberts) Heyer Competition does not count for branch points. This competition are open to every Member of every Branch, Associate Member of Alberta Women's Institutes and all Provincial Life members who do not belong to a branch. **Please see the enclosed information regarding these two special competitions.***
25. *Please refer to the Alberta Women's Institutes Policy Book for information regarding prizes, and point calculation policy to determine prize winners.*
26. *When removing articles from the display area, the article must be checked out by the Provincial Handicraft Coordinator. There will be no EXCEPTIONS for anyone. The person who is picking up the articles must also sign that she has received all of the articles*
27. *Please keep in mind to pack your articles securely in order to prevent loss or damage. **No Open Containers** will be accepted. Please number your Containers (ex. 1/3, 2/3 3/3 etc.)*
28. *For further information please contact your current Provincial Handicraft Coordinator. Her name and telephone number are listed in the Home and Country.*
29. *Information printed in the current Policy Book Supersedes all Rules and Guidelines.*
