Convention Planning

Thank you so much to everyone for getting your responses in to our Convention questionnaire as quickly as you did. That enabled us to make a decision for the Convention dates based on those responses.

A third of respondents attended the 2023 Convention while 2/3 did not. All percentages reported here are a percentage of the total number who answered, as some questions allowed more than one option to be selected and some people selected multiple options which was okay as we needed to know all the dates that would work so we could select the dates that worked for the most people. For 38% of those who did not attend it was because they could not attend on weekdays due to work or other commitments; for 32% it was the cost. Some people checked both. 70% preferred to attend Convention in person rather than virtually, but 33% said they would appreciate a virtual option. When it came to days of the week, 54% said any days were good for them; some also picked a preference. 32% of people preferred the current days of Tuesday and Wednesday, and Thursday in an election year. 41% of people preferred the weekend. Those who preferred the weekend weren't all in agreement as to which days

of the weekend were best, however Friday & Saturday were selected by 61% of those who preferred weekends. Handicrafts were very well liked: 44% of respondents reported that they entered handicrafts while a further 44% of respondents really enjoyed looking at the handicrafts.

As a result of the responses, the Convention Committee recommended to Council, and Council agreed, that we select June 7&8 for this year's Convention.

The whole point of this exercise was to select dates for our Convention that work for more members and therefore enable more to participate, so I hope that we will get a good turnout of those people who have been unable to attend in the past, as well as those who usually come to Convention. The Convention registration package will be coming out shortly. Be sure to register soon to get the Early Bird Rate which is good till May 1st. The deadline to send in your branch list of Handicrafts is May 15.
